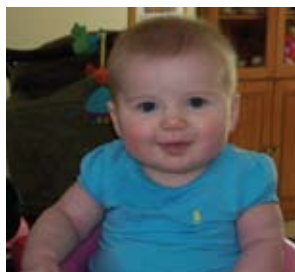

AS I SAT down on the evening of Jan. 21 to review the latest Evans happenings in the Winter Mac Report, I also turned on the Golf Channel to catch up on the Bob Hope Classic.

So I chose to caddy for Bob Hope. While I did have the opportunity later on to shag balls on the driving range for Jack, I never did caddy for him, but I have no regrets. Caddying for Bob Hope was a wonderful, unforgettable experience.

THAT EVENING of nostalgia was heightened as I reflected on the 45 years since that day in my senior year of high school. Four great years as an Evans

Scholar at Ohio State, three years as a U.S. Army armor officer/ aviator and the 37 years in business were all great experiences. Last year, I was again fortunate to be able to retire after 35 years at the xpedx division of International Paper.

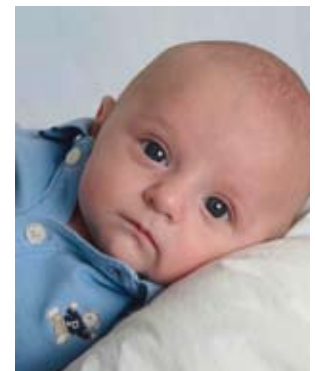
