Sending caddies to college since 1930

The Evans Scholars Foundation awards full tuition and housing college scholarships to high-achieving caddies with limited financial means. Established in 1930 by the Western Golf Association and celebrated amateur golfer Charles "Chick" Evans Jr., the Foundation oversees the nation's largest scholarship program for caddies. Evans Scholars are enrolled at 18 leading universities nationwide, including 16 where the Foundation operates a Scholarship House.
